### Three Colours Cezanne

Sky Arts, 6.00pm

❖ With his intense, layered application of colour and the distinctively warped perspectives of his paintings, which later became stimuli for modernists such as Picasso and Matisse, Paul Cezanne was written off by many of his contemporaries as a clumsy, provincial amateur, and didn't manage a solo exhibition until he was 56. This absorbing documentary tells the rather sad story of his life, and offsets it against some persuasively expressive testimonials from modern-day artists and critics, including Howard Hodgkin and Mary Tompkins Lewis. Most persuasive of all, though, are the stills of Cezanne's paintings themselves.

### UK Border Force

❖ Sky1's observational documentary series about UK Immigration Officers continues tonight, with teams from the Border Agency fanning out, a little like extras from *The Bourne Supremacy*, during rush hour in London, searching for illegal immigrants among the thousands of ashen-faced commuters. Meanwhile, over in Heathrow, a man traveling from the Caribbean is detained,

X-rayed and found to have nearly 100 bags of cocaine in his bowel.

### True Stories: Chosen

❖ This striking feature-length documentary by Brian Woods tells the story of three men who, 30 years after they were at prep school together, decided to air their claims that sexual abuse was meted out to them at school. Speaking straight to camera, with an eloquence often lacking in mainstream coverage of paedophilia, they make an affecting case. One of the boy's teachers pleaded guilty to multiple charges, including buggery, but served only one year of a two-year sentence. The comedian Billy Connolly, himself a victim of sexual abuse as a child, has said that this film should be required viewing in schools across the country.

### Coming of Age

BBC3, 10.30pm

❖ Pitched somewhere between E4's *Skins* and the Beeb's *Two Pints of Lager and a Packet of Crisps*, this sitcom, written by teenager Tim Dawson, clearly has the youth demographic in mind. It's set in and around a sixth-form college in Oxfordshire, with an exclusively youthful cast (even the teacher, played by Ed Coleman, can be hardly out of his twenties) and plotlines involving stolen coursework, romantic mishaps and, predominantly, sex. Crudeness abounds - "She's big, she's fat and she's minging: she'd obviously be well up for it!" is a representative sample - but neither wit nor charm have tagged along for the ride.
